HEARING DECISION

This matter was conducted by Administrative Law Judge [REDACTED] on September 17, 2007 pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon the Claimant's request for hearing received by the Department. Judge [REDACTED] left State employment before the hearing decision was written. The undersigned Administrative Law Judge has written this hearing decision after review of evidence in the record. At the hearing, the Claimant was present and testified. Also present on behalf of Claimant was [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] appeared on behalf of the Department.

ISSUE

Whether the Department properly determined that the Claimant was not disabled for purposes of Medical Assistance ("MA") program.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. Claimant filed for MA & SDA on November 27, 2006.
2. The Department denied Claimant's MA application on April 25, 2007.
3. The Department granted SDA on May 9, 2007.
4. Subsequent to the hearing, the Social Security Administration determined that the Claimant met the disability criteria for the RSDI program effective [REDACTED] Claimant's onset date was [REDACTED]

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.1 *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

Because of the Social Security Administration determination, it is not necessary for the Administrative Law Judge to discuss the issue of disability. PEM 260. The SSA decision was not appealed thus became final and binding on the Claimant's MA case. Ultimately, the Department did not establish that it acted in accordance with department policy when it denied the Claimant MA coverage. The negative action notice is REVERSED.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the findings of fact and conclusions of law, finds that there was insufficient evidence presented to affirm the Department's actions.

Accordingly, it is ORDERED that:

1. The Claimant meets the definition of disabled under the Medical Assistance Program at the application day of 4/27/06.
