HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a hearing was held on May 5, 2009.

ISSUE

Was the denial of claimant's application for MA-P and SDA for lack of disability correct?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- (1) Claimant applied for MA-P and SDA on October 2, 2007.
- (2) On November 2, 2007, the Medical Review Team denied MA-P and SDA.
- (3) On February 25, 2008, claimant filed for hearing.
- (4) On May 15, 2008, the State Hearing Review Team denied MA-P and SDA.
- (5) On May 2, 2009, a hearing was held before the Administrative Law Judge.

- (6) Claimant was given extra time to obtain existing medical documents he wished to submit into the record.
- (7) These records were never returned.
- (8) The Administrative Law Judge, in deference to claimant's personal situation and difficulties, kept the record open to allow claimant extra time to return the requested documents.
- (9) On June 12, 2009, the Social Security Administration Office of Disability Adjudication and Review issued an on the record decision in claimant's case, finding disability for the purpose of securing SSI income.
- (10) Claimant never informed the Department or the Administrative Law Judge of this decision.
- (11) The Administrative Law Judge found out about the decision through a routine check of the case and a SOLQ report.
- (12) The Social Security Administration gave claimant a disability onset date of October 17, 2006.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The State Disability Assistance (SDA) program which provides financial assistance for disabled persons is established by 2004 PA 344. The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the SDA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MAC R 400.3151-400.3180. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department

of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

Department policy at PEM 260 states that if a claimant has been found eligible for either SSI or RSDI based upon a finding of disability, the person meets the Department's MA disability criteria. No other evidence is required to establish disability. In the present case, the claimant was found by the Social Security Administration to be eligible for SSI benefits based upon disability, and a SOLQ report obtained by the Administrative Law Judge confirms the same. This disability was found by the Social Security Administration to have an onset date of October 17, 2006, almost a year before claimant requested MA-P. Therefore, the Administrative Law Judge finds that the claimant met the Department's definition of disabled for the purposes of MA-P and SDA.


#### DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, decides that the claimant is medically disabled for the purposes of the MA and SDA program, pending a review of all non-medical eligibility factors.

Accordingly, the Department's decision in the above stated matter is, hereby, REVERSED.

The Department is ORDERED to process claimant's Medicaid application of October 12, 2007, and initiate a review of all non-medical eligibility factors, if it has not already done so.

The Department is further ORDERED to initiate a full review of this case in July, 2011.
