ORDER OF DISMISSAL

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge by authority of MCL 400.9; and MCL 400.37 upon claimant's request for a hearing filed on May 20, 2008. After due notice, a hearing was held on April 1, 2009.

Prior to the closure of the hearing record, the claimant no longer disagreed with the correctness of the negative case action (MA changed on March 7, 2008 from a TMA to a deductible case), which was the subject matter of this hearing.

Claimant wants an exception to the DHS policy, granting her a non-deductible Medicaid case based on her financial hardship.

Administrative law judges have no authority to make decisions on constitutional grounds, overrule statutes, overrule promulgated regulations or overrule or make exceptions to the department policy set out in the program manuals. Delegation of Hearing Authority, August 9, 2002, per PA 1939, Section 9, Act 280.

This Administrative Law Judge, as a matter of law, has no legal authority to grant the claimant's requested exception to DHS policy requirements based on her financial hardship.

Therefore, it is not necessary for the Administrative Law Judge to decide the matter that was in dispute. Pursuant to MAC R 400.906 and 400.903, claimant's hearing request is HEREBY DISMISSED, because claimant is no longer aggrieved by a department action.
