HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9; and MCL 400.37 upon claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, an in-person hearing was held on September 25, 2008. Claimant was represented by [REDACTED].

ISSUE

Whether claimant has established disability for purposes of qualifying for Medical Assistance (MA)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

(1) March 11, 2008, claimant applied for MA. Claimant submitted medical records for department consideration.

(2) March 19, 2008, the Medical Review Team (MRT) denied claimant's application.

(3) March 26, 2008, the department sent claimant written notice that her application was denied.

(4) June 27, 2008, the department received claimant's timely request for hearing.

(5) July 25, 2008, the State hearing Review Team (SHRT) denied claimant's application. Department B.

(6) September 25, 2008, the in-person hearing was held. Prior to the closing of the record, claimant requested the record be left open for additional medical evidence. Claimant waived the right to a timely hearing decision.

(7) April 3, 2009, after review of new medical evidence, the SHRT approved claimant's disability. The SHRT Decision notes that claimant was approved for Supplemental Security Income benefits. SHRT Decision, 4/03/09.

(8) Claimant meets the disability requirements to qualify for MA effective with the earliest retroactive month of application.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

Department manuals provide the following policy statements and instructions for caseworkers:

A person meets the disability or blindness factor for a month if he is determined disabled or blind for the month being tested.

In this case, the claimant received a fully favorable decision from the SHRT regarding claimant's disability. The SHRT determined that claimant is disabled. Finding of Fact (FOF) 7-8. As such, it is not necessary for the Administrative Law Judge to discuss claimant's disability.

Claimant meets the disability requirements under the law for Medical Assistance effective the earliest appropriate retroactive month prior to his March 11, 2008 application.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, decides that claimant has established disability for purposes of Medical Assistance effective with the earliest retro active month of application.

Accordingly, the department's action is **HEREBY REVERSED**. If it has not already done so, the department is to initiate an evaluation of claimant's financial eligibility for Medical

Assistance beginning with the earliest retro active month of application. If otherwise eligible, medical review date is set for March 2010.
