# RECONSIDERATION DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9;

MSA 16.409 and MCL 400.37; MSA 16.437 upon claimant's request for a hearing to protest

Medicaid/SDA denial. After due notice, a hearing was held February 12, 2009. Claimant was

**ISSUE** 

Whether claimant meets the disability criteria for Medicaid/SDA?

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

 On September 4, 2007, the claimant applied for Medicaid/SDA and was denied on August 14, 2008 per PEM 264/261. (2) On February 27, 2009, SHRT reversed its decision and approved the claimant retroactive to June 2007 and SDA in accordance with PEM 261 with a recommendation of a medical review in March 2010.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The State Disability Assistance (SDA) program which provides financial assistance for disabled persons is established by 2004 PA 344. The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the SDA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MAC R 400.3151-400.3180. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

Because of the SHRT determination, it is not necessary for the Administrative Law Judge to discuss the issue of disability, per Program Administrative Manual, Item 600.

The department is required to initiate a determination of claimant's financial eligibility for the requested benefits if not previously done.

#### DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, decides that the claimant meets the definition of medically disabled under Medicaid/SDA as of June 2007 for Medicaid and in accordance with PEM 261 for SDA.

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Accordingly, Medicaid/SDA denial is REVERSED.

A medical review recommended in March 2010.
