HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9; MSA 16.409 and MCL 400.37; MSA 16.437 upon claimant's March 28, 2008 request for a hearing to protest the department's denial of the claimant's medical review of State Disability Assistance (SDA) and a new application denial of Medical Assistance (MA-P). After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on Thursday, August 28, 2008. The claimant was present and testified on his own behalf with his girlfriend, [REDACTED] as a witness.

ISSUE

Whether claimant meets the disability criteria for SDA and MA-P?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- (1) The claimant was eligible for SDA with a medical review March 2008.
- (2) On February 5, 2008, the claimant reapplied for MA benefits and submitted the required information for SDA benefits.
- (3) Subsequent to the hearing, the Social Security Administration determined that the claimant met the disability criteria for the RSDI program effective [REDACTED].

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The State Disability Assistance (SDA) program which provides financial assistance for disabled persons is established by 2004 PA 344. The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the SDA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MAC R 400.3151-400.3180. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

Because of the Social Security Administration determination, it is not necessary for the Administrative Law Judge to discuss the issue of disability. PEM, Item 260; PEM, Item 261.

The department is required to initiate a determination of claimant's financial eligibility for the requested benefits, if not previously done.

The claimant is eligible for MA based on his February 5, 2008 application and SDA based on his medical review of March 2008.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, decides that the claimant meets the definition of medically disabled under MA based on his February 5, 2008 and SDA based on his March 2008 medical review.

Accordingly, the department is ORDERED to initiate a review of his February 5, 2008 MA application and as of his March 2008 medical review of SDA, if it has not already done so, to determine if all other non-medical eligibility criteria are met. The department shall inform the claimant of the determination in writing.
