HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a hearing was held on May 14, 2009. The claimant was represented by [REDACTED].

ISSUE

Did the Department of Human Services (DHS or department) properly process claimant's application for Medical Assistance (MA-P) program benefits?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1) On October 19, 2007, an application was filed on claimant's behalf for MA-P benefits. The application requested MA-P retroactive to July 2007.
- 2) Thereafter, on April 8, 2008, a hearing request was filed to protest the department's failure to provide requested benefits.

- 3) At the hearing, the department reported that it had opened MA-P for claimant effective September 1, 2008. The department further agreed to open MA-P for claimant retroactive to July 1, 2007.
- 4) Claimant authorized representative indicated satisfaction with the department's plan of action.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

The law provides that disposition may be made of a contestant case by stipulation or agreed settlement. MCL 24.278 (2). In this case, the parties reached an accord. The department agreed to open MA-P for claimant effective July 1, 2007. Claimant's authorized representative indicated satisfaction with the department's plan of action.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, decides that the Department of Human Services shall open Medical Assistance for claimant effective July 1, 2007.
