HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a hearing was held on May 11, 2009. Claimant appeared and testified.

ISSUE

Whether the Department of Human Services (Department) properly determined that

Claimant is not "disabled" for purposes of Medical Assistance (MA) program and State

Disability Assistance (SDA)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as a material fact:

- 1. On October 31, 2008, Claimant applied for MA-P and SDA.
- 2. On December 30, 2008, the Medical Review Team denied Claimant's request.
- 3. On January 14, 2009, Claimant submitted to the Department a request for hearing.

- 4. The State Hearing and Review Team denied Claimant's request.
- Subsequent to the hearing, the Social Security Administration determined that Claimant met the disability criteria for the SSI program effective November 12, 2008.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Medical Assistance (MA-P) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department administers the MA-P program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (BAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (BEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

The State Disability Assistance (SDA) program which provides financial assistance for disabled persons is established by 2004 PA 344. The Department administers the SDA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MAC R 400.3151-400.3180. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (BAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (BEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

Because of the Social Security Administration's determination, it is not necessary for the Administrative Law Judge to discuss the issue of disability, per Program Eligibility Manual, Item 260.

The Department is required to initiate a determination of the Claimant's financial eligibility for the requested benefits, if not previously done.

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DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of

law, decides that the Claimant is medically disabled under the MA program as of November 2008.

Accordingly, the Department is hereby ORDERED to open an ongoing MA-P case for the Claimant effective October of 2008 based upon BAM 115, p. 8.
