HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on August 19, 2009.

ISSUE

Was excess income established?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

(1) Negative case action: proposed Medicaid termination on January 3, 2009 and change to a deductible based on excess income in the monthly amount of \$192 per PEM 545 and PRT 240.

(2) In December, the claimant had a two member household and a protected income level #1 of \$458 with a monthly earned income of \$740 and a standard work expense deduction of \$90.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

Facts above are undisputed.

The undisputed facts above establish monthly excess income of \$192.

\$740 monthly earned income
\$90 standard work expense deduction
\$650 net income

\$458 protected monthly income.
\$650
\$192 excess income

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, decides that excess income was established.

Proposed Medicaid termination and change to a deductible are UPHELD.
