HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9;

MSA 16.409 and MCL 400.37; MSA 16.437 upon claimant's request for a hearing to protest

Medicaid denial. After due notice, a hearing was held February 10, 2009.

<u>ISSUE</u>

Whether claimant meets the disability criteria for Medicaid?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

 On May 6, 2008, the claimant applied for Medicaid and was denied on July 23, 2009 pursuant to PEM 260.

(2) SHRT decision dated March 3, 2009 reversed its decision in favor of the claimant and approved Medicaid effective February 2009.

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CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

Because of the SHRT determination, it is not necessary for the Administrative Law Judge to discuss the issue of disability, per Program Administrative Manual, Item 600.

The department is required to initiate a determination of claimant's financial eligibility for the requested benefits, if not previously done.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, decides that the claimant meets the definition of medically disabled under Medicaid program as of February 2009.

Accordingly, Medicaid denial is REVERSED, and approved effective February 2009.

At medical review (February 2010) obtain 49 series forms and updated medical records from March 2009 to current.
