HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9; MSA 16.409 and MCL 400.37; MSA 16.437 upon the Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice a telephone hearing was held on March 30, 2009. The Claimant personally appeared and testified.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly open the Claimant's Child Care (CDC)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. On November 20, 2008, the claimant applied for CDC.
- 2. The department referred the claimant to Jobs Education and Training (JET).
- 3. The Claimant informed the department that she was beginning work.

- 4. On January 7, 2009, the department provided the claimant with employment verification forms that were to be returned by January 15, 2009.
- 5. On January 15, 2009, the department sent the claimant notice that her CDC was denied for failure to return verification. (Department exhibit 3).
- 6. On February 5, 2009, the Claimant filed a request for a hearing.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Child Development and Care program is established by Titles IVA, IVE and XX of the Social Security Act, the Child Care and Development Block Grant of 1990, and the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996. The program is implemented by Title 45 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Parts 98 and 99. The Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) provides services to adults and children pursuant to MCL 400.14(1) and MAC R 400.5001-5015. Department policies are contained in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

The law provides that disposition may be made of a contested case by stipulation or agreed settlement. MCL 24. 278(2). In the instant case, the parties reached an accord. The Department will accept documentation of the claimant's work and certification of her CDC provider. Upon presentation of both the department will pay any CDC properly owed.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge based on the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, REVERSES AND ORDERS the Department to accept documentation of the claimant's work and certification of her CDC provider. Upon presentation of both the department will pay any CDC properly owed.
