HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a hearing was held on January 22, 2009. Claimant was represented by [REDACTED] of [REDACTED].

ISSUE

Did the Department of Human Services (DHS or department) properly determine that claimant is not "disabled" for purposes of the Medical Assistance (MA-P) program?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

(1) On February 26, 2008, an application was filed on claimant's behalf for MA-P benefits. The application sought MA-P retroactive to November of 2007.

(2) On May 13, 2008, the department denied claimant's application for benefits based upon the belief that claimant did not meet the requisite disability criteria.

(3) On August 5, 2008, a hearing request was filed to protest the department's determination.

(4) Thereafter, the Social Security Administration awarded claimant disability benefits with a disability onset date of September 1, 2005.

(5) At the hearing, the parties reached an accord. The department agreed to initiate reconsideration of claimant's February 26, 2008 application for MA-P in light of the Social Security Administration award.

(6) Claimant's authorized representative indicated satisfaction with the department's plan of action.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

The law provides that disposition may be made of a contested case by stipulation or agreed settlement. MCL 24.278(2). In this matter, the parties reached an accord. The department agreed to initiate reconsideration of claimant's February 26, 2008 application for MA-P. The department agreed to notify claimant and her authorized representative of its determination in writing.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, decides that the Department of Human Services shall initiate reconsideration of the February 26, 2008 application for Medical Assistance. The department shall notify claimant and her authorized representative of its determination in writing.
