HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on June 10, 2009. Claimant and her father personally appeared and testified.

ISSUE

Did the department properly deny claimant's October 30, 2008 Medicaid (MA) and State Disability Assistance (SDA) application based on lack of disability?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- (1) On October 30, 2008, claimant applied for MA/SDA.
- (2) When the department denied that application claimant requested a hearing to dispute the denial.
- (3) Claimant's hearing was held on June 10, 2009.

(4) While claimant's appeal was pending, she received a fully favorable disability allowance from the Social Security Administration (SSA), with her disability onset established as of November 12, 2006, per a computerized cross-check (SOLQ) received by the presiding Administrative Law Judge on August 30, 2010.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

The State Disability Assistance (SDA) program which provides financial assistance for disabled persons is established by 2004 PA 344. The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the SDA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MAC R 400.3151-400.3180. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

In Michigan, the SSA's determination of disability onset is binding for MA eligibility purposes. The same standard is applied in SDA cases. In the present case, evidence of the favorable SSA decision conclusively establishes claimant meets the federal disability standard necessary to qualify for MA/SDA, pursuant to BEM Items 150 and 260.

Claimant's documentation, received while her appeal was pending, shows claimant was determined disabled as of November 12, 2006, two years before her disputed MA/SDA

application was filed. Consequently, the department must reverse its erroneous denial and process claimant's disputed application in accordance with departmental policy.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, decides the department erred in determining claimant is not disabled.

Accordingly, the department's decision is REVERSED, and it is Ordered that:

(1) The department shall approve MA/SDA benefits for claimant as long as claimant is otherwise eligible to receive them.

(2) Departmental review of claimant's condition is not necessary as long as her SSA disability status continues.
