HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9;

MSA 16.409 and MCL 400.37; MSA 16.437 upon the Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice a telephone hearing was held on July 13, 2009. The Claimant personally appeared

and testified.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly calculate the Claimant's Family Independence Program

(FIP) and Food Assistance (FAP)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. The claimant is a FIP, FAP and MA recipient. The group size is seven (7).
- On April 13, 2009, the claimant met with the department as part of her annual redetermination for FIP, FAP and MA.

- 3. The department determined that the group size was reduced by two. The claimant's nineteen (19) year old son who is not expected to graduate high school before he turns twenty (20) years old was removed from the FIP grant and two other children receive SSI and cannot receive SSI and FIP simultaneously.
- 4. On April 17, 2009, the claimant filed a request for a hearing.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) (formerly known as the Food Stamp (FS) program) is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the FAP program pursuant to MCL 400.10, et seq., and MAC R 400.3001-3015. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

The Family Independence Program (FIP) was established pursuant to the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996, Public Law 104-193, 8 USC 601, et seq. The Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the FIP program pursuant to MCL 400.10, et seq., and MAC R 400.3101-3131. The FIP program replaced the Aid to Dependent Children (ADC) program effective October 1, 1996. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

At the hearing the claimant focused her concern on the inclusion of her new mortgage amount being used in benefit calculations.

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The law provides that disposition may be made of a contested case by stipulation or agreed settlement. MCL 24. 278(2). In the instant case, the parties reached an accord. The department agreed to accept and include documentation of a change in the claimant's mortgage and refigure her FAP and FIP and replace any lost benefits if appropriate.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above findings of fact and conclusions of

law, REVERSES AND ORDERS the department will accept and include documentation of a

change in the claimant's mortgage and refigure her FAP and FIP and replace any lost benefits if appropriate.
