# HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL

400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a

telephone hearing was conducted from on November 12, 2009.

## <u>ISSUE</u>

Whether the Department properly computed the Claimant's Food Assistance

Program (FAP) allotment and properly terminated Claimant's State Disability Assistance

(SDA) and Adult Medical Program (AMP) benefits?

## FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

(1) Claimant is a FAP recipient and was formerly a SDA and AMP recipient.

(2) On December 30, 2008, the Department completed a FAP budget which resulted in a monthly FAP allotment of the Claimant's monthly FAP allotment increased to the in July 2009 and the in September 2009 (Exhibit 7)

(3) On April 30, 2009, the Department completed an AMP budget which resulted in excess income. (Exhibits 5,6)

(4) On April 30, 2009, the Department sent Claimant notice that she no longer qualified for the AMP benefits due to excess income (Exhibit 2)

(5) On April 30, 2009, the Department completed a SDA budget which resulted in excess income. (Exhibits 4,6)

(6) On April 30, 2009, the Department sent Claimant notice that she was no longer eligible for SDA benefits due to excess income (Exhibit 3)

(7) On May 8, 2009, the Department received the Claimant's hearing request.<u>CONCLUSIONS OF LAW</u>

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) (formerly known as the Food Stamp (FS) program, is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (DHS or department), administers the FAP program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MAC R 400.3001-3015. Departmental policies are found in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), and the Bridges Reference Manual (BRM).

The State Disability Assistance (SDA) program which provides financial assistance for disabled persons is established by 2004 PA 344. The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the SDA program pursuant to

MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MAC R 400.3151-400.3180. Department policies are found in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) and the Bridges Reference Manual (BRM).

The Adult Medical Program (AMP) is established by Title XXI of the Social Security Act; (1115)(a)(1) of the Social Security Act, and is administered by the Department of Human Services (DHS or department) pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq*. Department policies are contained in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) and the Bridges Reference Manual (BRM).

All earned and unearned income available to the Claimant is countable. Earned income means income received from another person or organization or from self-employment for duties that were performed for remuneration or profit. Unearned income means ALL income that is not earned and includes FIP, RSDI, SSI and UB. The amount counted may be more than the client actually receives because the gross amount is used prior to any deductions. BEM 500

The Department determines a client's eligibility for program benefits based on the client's actual income and/or prospective income. Actual income is income that was already received. Prospective income is income not yet received but expected. Prospective budgeting is the best estimate of the client's future income. BEM 505

All income is converted to a standard monthly amount. If the client is paid weekly, the Department multiplies the average weekly amount by 4.3. If the client is paid every other week, the Department multiplies the average bi-weekly amount by 2.15. BEM 505

In the instant case, Claimant's FAP allotment was not reduced. In fact, it increased twice in 2009. The Department did determine that Claimant was not eligible for AMP and SDA benefits based on excess income. Based on the testimony and documentation offered at hearing, I find that the Department established that it acted in accordance with policy in computing Claimant's FAP allotment and terminating Claimant's SDA and AMP benefits.

#### DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, finds that the Department acted in accordance with policy in computing Claimant's FAP allotment and terminating Claimant's SDA and AMP benefits.

Accordingly, the Department's FAP, SDA and AMP eligibility determination(s) are AFFIRMED, it is SO ORDERED.


