#### HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, an in-person hearing was held on August 5, 2009. Claimant did not personally appear; however, she was represented by

#### **ISSUE**

Did the department properly deny claimant's January 6, 2009 Medicaid (MA), retro-MA and State Disability Assistance (SDA) application, based on a finding she lacks a legally disabling condition?

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

(1) On January 6, 2009, claimant applied for MA/retro-MA/SDA.

- (2) Claimant's application was denied and her authorized representative promptly filed a hearing request to protest the denial.
  - (3) Claimant's hearing was held on August 5, 2009.
- (4) Claimant's authorized representative provided this Administrative Law Judge with proof (Award Notice) verifying claimant was determined disabled by the Social Security Administration (SSA), with onset established as of April 2007 (Client Exhibit A).

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

The State Disability Assistance (SDA) program which provides financial assistance for disabled persons is established by 2004 PA 344. The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the SDA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MAC R 400.3151-400.3180. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

In Michigan, the SSA's determination of disability onset is binding for MA eligibility purposes. The same standard is applied in SDA cases, except for a shorter durational period of 90 days. In the present case, evidence of the favorable SSA decision conclusively establishes claimant meets the federal disability standard necessary to qualify for MA/retro-MA/SDA pursuant to PEM Items 150 and 260.

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Claimant has shown she was determined disabled as of April 2007. Consequently, the

department must reverse its erroneous denial and process claimant's disputed application in

accordance with departmental policy.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions

of law, decides the department erred in determining claimant is not disabled.

Accordingly, the department's decision is REVERSED, and it is Ordered that:

(1) The department shall approve MA/retro-MA/SDA benefits for claimant if she is

otherwise eligible to receive them.

(2) Departmental review of claimant's medical condition is not necessary as long as

SSA disability status continues.
