HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on Thursday, July 30, 2009. The claimant personally appeared and testified.

ISSUE

Did the department properly place the claimant's Medical Assistance (MA) case in spend-down status and determine her monthly deductible?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- (1) The claimant was a recipient of MA benefits.
- (2) The claimant is a recipient of Social Security RSDI income in the amount of

[REDACTED]. (Department Exhibit 1-2)

(3) On April 20, 2009, the claimant requested a hearing as she disagreed with the \$658 deductible where DHS contacted the Social Security Administration on May 14, 2009 and determined that the Medicare premium was not being paid by the State, resulting in a new budget being calculated for the claimant.

(4) On May 14, 2009, the department caseworker calculated the claimant's continued eligibility for MA benefits based on her monthly unearned Social Security RSDI income of

██████ (Department Exhibit 3):

- The claimant had a net unearned income of ██████, resulting from a \$20 unearned income general exclusion.
- The claimant had a protected income of \$391 for a group size of one for her shelter area.
- The claimant had an excess income or deductible of \$756, resulting from her net income of ██████ minus her protected income of \$391.
- The claimant qualified for the Medicare Savings Program, which pays her Medicare premium of \$96.40.

(5) On May 14, 2009, the department caseworker sent the claimant a notice that due to excess income that she would have a spend-down/deductible amount of \$756, which she must meet in order to become Group II MA eligible.

### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

## **MA GROUP 2 INCOME ELIGIBILITY**

### **Deductible**

Deductible is a process which allows a client with excess income to become eligible for Group 2 MA if sufficient allowable medical expenses are incurred.

### **Active Deductible**

Open an MA case **without ongoing Group 2 MA coverage** on CIMS as long as:

- . The fiscal group has excess income, **and**
- . At least one fiscal group member meets all other Group 2 MA eligibility factors.

Such cases are called active deductible cases. Periods of MA coverage are added on CIMS each time the group meets its deductible.

### **Deductible Period**

Each calendar month is a separate spend-down period.

### **Deductible Amount**

The fiscal group's monthly excess income is called a deductible amount. PEM 545, pp. 8-9.

### **Meeting a Deductible**

Meeting a deductible means reporting and verifying allowable medical expenses (defined in "**EXHIBIT I**") that equal or exceed the deductible amount for the calendar month tested. PEM, Item 545, p. 9.

The group must report expenses by the last day of the third month following the month for which it wants MA coverage. PAM 130 explains verification and timeliness standards. PEM, Item 545, p. 9.

The goal of the Medicaid program is to ensure that essential health care services are made available to those who otherwise could not afford them. Medicaid is also known as Medical Assistance (MA). PEM 105.

The State of Michigan has set guidelines for income, which determine if an MA group is eligible. Income eligibility exists for the calendar month tested when:

- . There is no excess income, **or**
- . Allowable medical expenses equal or exceed the excess income (under the Deductible Guidelines). PEM 545.

Net income (countable income minus allowable income deductions) must be at or below a certain income limit for eligibility to exist. PEM 105. Income eligibility exists when net income does **not** exceed the Group 2 needs in PEM 544. PEM 166. The protected income level is a set allowance for non-medical need items such as shelter, food and incidental expenses. PRT 240 lists the Group 2 MA protected income levels based on shelter area and fiscal group size. PEM 544. An eligible Medical Assistance group (Group 2 MA) has income the same as or less than the “protected income level” as set forth in the policy contained in the Program Reference Table (PRT).

An individual or MA group whose income is in excess of the monthly protected income level is ineligible to receive MA. However, a MA group may become eligible for assistance under the deductible program. The deductible program is a process, which allows a client with excess income to be eligible for MA, if sufficient allowable medical expenses are incurred. Each calendar month is a separate deductible period. The fiscal group’s monthly excess income is called the deductible amount. Meeting a deductible means reporting and verifying allowable medical expenses that equal or exceed the deductible amount for the calendar month. The MA

group must report expenses by the last day of the third month following the month it wants medical coverage. PEM 545; 42 CFR 435.831.

In this case, the claimant has a fiscal group net income of [REDACTED]. The claimant's protected income level in her shelter area for a group size of one is \$391. PRT 240. The claimant's Medicare premium of \$96.40 is being paid by the State through the Medicare Savings Program. After subtracting the claimant's total needs amount of \$391 from her total fiscal group net income of [REDACTED], the claimant would be left with the deductible amount of \$756.

Therefore, the claimant's MA deductible determination must be upheld.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, decides that the department properly placed the claimant's MA case in spend-down status and determined the monthly deductible amount of \$756.

Accordingly, the department's MA deductible action is **AFFIRMED**.
