HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9;

MSA 16.409 and MCL 400.37; MSA 16.437 upon the Claimant's request for a hearing. After

due notice a telephone hearing was held on March 4, 2010. The Claimant personally appeared

and testified.

<u>ISSUE</u>

Whether the Department was correct in denying the claimant's Medical Assistance

(MA)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- On March 17, 2009, the Claimant filed an application for Medical Assistance based on disability.
- 2. On May 15, 2009, the department denied the claimant's MA application.
- 3. On May 15, 2009, the claimant's AR filed a request for a hearing.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, et seq., and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

In this case the Department did not provide evidence that supports its actions.

ELIGIBILITY DECISIONS

Denials

All Programs

If the group is ineligible **or** refuses to cooperate in the application process, send a denial notice within the standard of promptness. (PAM 115, p.15).

In the instant case the department has not sent a denial notice nor has produced any

documentation as to why it denied the claimant's MA.

The undersigned finds that the department incorrectly denied the claimant's MA.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge based on the above findings of fact and conclusions of

law, REVERSES and ORDERS the department to reregister the Claimant's March 17, 2009, MA

application.
