HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9; and MCL 400.37 upon claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on July 28, 2009. Claimant personally appeared and testified along with a friend J.V.

ISSUE

Did the department correctly deny claimant's Food Assistance Program (FAP) application in June, 2009?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. Claimant applied for FAP on May 28, 2009. Department completed a FAP budget which resulted in excess income. (Department's Exhibit 1).
2. Department denied claimant's FAP application on June 5, 2009. Claimant requested a hearing on June 12, 2009.

## CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) (formerly known as the Food Stamp (FS) program) is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the FAP program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MAC R 400.3001-3015. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

Hearing testimony reveals that the claimant lives with her baby, father of the baby, and father's parents. Baby's father is under the age of 22. Department's policy states:

### **FOOD ASSISTANCE PROGRAM GROUP COMPOSITION**

#### **DEPARTMENT POLICY**

You must determine who is included in the Food Assistance Program (FAP) group prior to evaluating the nonfinancial and financial eligibility of everyone in the group.

To establish FAP group composition determine:

1. Who lives together.
2. The relationship(s) of the people who live together.
3. Whether the people living together purchase and prepare food together or separately, and
4. Whether the person(s) resides in an eligible living situation. (See "LIVING SITUATIONS" in this item.)

PEM, Item 212, p. 1.

#### **RELATIONSHIPS**

The relationship(s) of the people who live together affects whether they must be included or excluded from the group. First determine

if they **must** be included in the group. If they are **not** mandatory group members, then determine if they purchase and prepare food together or separately. PEM, Item 212, p. 1.

**Spouses**

Spouses who are legally married and live together **must** be in the same group. PEM, Item 212, p. 1.

**Parents and Children**

Children include natural, step and adopted children.

Parents and their children **under 22 years of age** who live together **must** be in the same group regardless of whether the child has his/her own spouse or child who lives with the group. PEM, Item 212, p. 1.

The policy clearly places the claimant, her baby, the father of the baby and his parents in the same FAP group. Therefore, all of the income and assets of these individuals must be considered when determining FAP eligibility, which the department correctly did resulting in excess income.

Claimant and her friend state that the father of her baby no longer receives RSDI as he turned 18 years of age and is no longer in school. Department's representative indicates that she will compute another FAP budget to see if removal of RSDI results in FAP eligibility.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, decides that the department correctly denied claimant's FAP application in June, 2009.

Accordingly, department's action is AFFIRMED, and it is SO ORDERED.
