HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9; MSA 16.409 and MCL 400.37; MSA 16.437 upon the Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice a telephone hearing was held on March 1, 2010. The Claimant was personally appeared and testified. Claimant was represented by his authorized representative,

ISSUE

Did the Department properly deny the claimant's Medical Assistance (MA) and retroactive Medical Assistance?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

On September 5, 2008, the claimant, applied for MA and retroactive MA. (Department's exhibit 4)

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- On February 9, 2009, the department sent the claimant a verification checklist, due February 19, 2009, requesting various information. (Department exhibit 3)
- 3. On March 7, 2009, the department denied the applications for failure to provide verifications. (Department exhibit 1).
- 5. On April 7, 2009, the Claimant filed a request for a hearing.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, et seq., and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

In the instant case, the claimant contacted the department and left repeated messages seeking the assistance of the department in securing documents requested by the department.

Obtaining Verification

All Programs

... The client must obtain required verification, but you must assist if they need and request help.

If neither the client nor you can obtain verification despite a reasonable effort, use the best available information. If **no** evidence is available, use your best judgment. (PAM 130, pp. 2-3)

I find the claimant's testimony credible and that the department did not assist the claimant contrary to the policy cited above. Therefore, the department was in error if it denied the claimant's MA and retroactive MA.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge based on the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, REVERSES AND ORDERS the department to reregister the claimant's MA and retroactive MA applications back to the original application date of September 5, 2008.
