HEARING DECISION

ISSUE

Whether the Department is entitled to recoup a \$1,529.00 FAP over-issuance for the period from November 2008 through March 2009 due to the Department's failure to properly include Claimant's wife's earnings?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

Claimant was an active FAP recipient.

- 2. At the time of application, Claimant's wife reported that she was a school year employee at Schools.
- 3. Claimant and Claimant's wife testified that she turned in pay stubs after she returned to work in the fall.
- 4. The Department failed to add Claimant's income to the budget.
- 5. Once the error was discovered, the Department recalculated the Claimant's FAP budget and determined there was an over-issuance of FAP benefits totaling \$1,529.00. (Exhibits 3 and 4).
- 6. The Department referred the case to a Recoupment Specialist ("RS") for investigation. (Exhibit 1).
- 7. As a result of Agency error, the Claimant received a FAP over-issuance for the period from November, 2008 through March, 2009. (Exhibit 4).
- 8. On May 23, 2009, the Department received the Claimant's written request for a hearing protesting the proposed recoupment action.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Food Assistance Program, formerly known as the Food Stamp ("FS") program, is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations ("CFR"). The Department of Human Services ("DHS"), formally known as the Family Independence Agency, administers the FAP program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq* and MAC R 400.3001-3015. Departmental policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual ("PAM"), the Program Eligibility Manual ("PEM"), and the Program Reference Manual ("PRM").

In this case, the Department seeks recoupment of an over-issuance of FAP benefits due to the Department's failure to properly include Claimant's wife's income. An over-issuance ("OI") occurs when a client group receives more benefits than they are entitled to receive. PAM 700, p. 1. A claim is the resulting debt created by the overissuance of benefits (OI). <u>Id.</u> Recoupment is an action to identify and recover a benefit. <u>Id.</u> The Department must take reasonable steps to promptly correct any overpayment of public assistance benefits, whether due to department or client error. PAMs 700, 705, 715, and 725. An agency error OI is caused by incorrect actions by DHS, DIT staff, or department processes. PAM 705, p. 1. In general, agency error OIs are not pursued if OI amount is under \$500.00 per program. PAM 705, pp. 1-3.

Based on the evidence and testimony presented on the record, the undersigned finds that the Claimant provided verification of her income and properly informed her caseworker that she would be receiving income during the school year. The Department failed to properly input the income and the budget was calculated without Claimant's wife's income. This failure of the Department resulted in an overpayment for the period November, 2008 – March, 2008 totaling \$1,529.00. Unfortunately, the overpayment is over \$500.00 and pursuant to Pursuant to PAM 705, the Department is entitled to recoupment. While this Administrative Law Judge does not necessarily agree with the Department policy, this Judge's jurisdiction is limited to interpreting whether the Department followed the regulations. Accordingly, the Department's OI and recoupment action is AFFIRMED.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, finds that the Department properly calculated the Claimant's FAP benefits to be overpaid in

the amount of \$1,529.00 based on department error. Accordingly, it is ordered that the OI and recoupment is AFFIRMED.
