HEARING DECISION

ISSUE

Whether the Department properly closed Claimant's FIP case on 7/7/09 due to Claimant's failure to submit wage verifications?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. Claimant was a FAP recipient.
- Claimant's FAP case was closed on 7/7/09 for failure to submit wage verifications. However, pay stubs were submitted.

- 3. The Department agreed to reopen and reprocess the case from the date of closure, 7/7/09.
- 4. As a result of this agreement, Claimant indicated that he no longer wished to proceed with a hearing.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) (formerly known as the Food Stamp (FS) program) is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the FAP program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MAC R 400.3001-3015. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

Under Program Administrative Manual Item 600, clients have the right to contest any agency decision affecting eligibility or benefit levels whenever they believe the decision is illegal. The agency provides an Administrative Hearing to review the decision and determine if it is appropriate. Agency policy includes procedures to meet the minimal requirements for a fair hearing. Efforts to clarify and resolve the client's concerns start when the agency receives a hearing request and continues through the day of the hearing.

In the present case, the Department has agreed to reopen and reprocess Claimant's case from the date of closure, 7/7/09, and to supplement the Claimant for any FAP benefits that he was entitled to receive from that date of application forward. Furthermore, the Department has agreed to accept Claimant's wage verification from the Census at face value based on recent documentation and to contact the public school where Claimant's wife works to verify employment. As a result of this agreement, Claimant indicated he no longer wished to proceed

with the hearing. Since the Claimant and the Department have come to an agreement it is unnecessary for this Administrative Law Judge to make a decision regarding the facts and issues in this case.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the findings of fact and conclusions of law, finds that the Department and Claimant have come to a settlement regarding claimant's request for a hearing.

Accordingly, it is ORDERED:

- 1. The Department shall reopen and reprocess the FAP case from the date of closure, 7/7/09 according to Department policy. As part of the reprocess, the Department shall accept Claimant's wage info from the Census and make a phone call to the public school where Claimant's wife works regarding wage verification.
- 2. The Department shall supplement the Claimant for any lost benefits he was otherwise entitled to receive from the date of application forward.
