ORDER OF DISMISSAL

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge by authority of MCL 400.9; and MCL 400.37 upon claimant's request for a hearing filed on July 26, 2009. After due notice, a hearing was held February 23, 2010.

Prior to the closure of the hearing record, the DHS rescinded the negative case action (Medicaid application on November 7, 2008 was denied on March 3, 2009 based on noncompliance with timely verification requirements per PAM 210 and PEM 500) which was the subject matter of this hearing, and agreed to process the claimant's March 30, 2009 second verification extended request and rendered a written decision in accordance with DHS policy requirements.

It is ORDERED that:

- (1) The negative case action stated above is rescinded,
- (2) The DHS process the claimant's March 30, 2009 second requested extended verification request within 10 work days and process a written approval or denial in accordance with DHS policy requirements.

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Therefore, it is not necessary for the Administrative Law Judge to decide the matter that was in dispute. Pursuant to MAC R 400.906 and 400.903, claimant's hearing request is HEREBY DISMISSED, because claimant is no longer aggrieved by a department action.
