### HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge upon pursuant to MCL 400. 9; MCL 400.37 upon claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice a telephone hearing was held on October 19, 2009 claimant was present and testified, ES appeared for the department and testified.

#### **ISSUE**

Is the department correct in determining claimant's FAP benefits?

### FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- (1) Claimant was a FAP recipient.
- The department reduced claimant's FAP benefits on October 1, 2009 to \$16 per month (2) for a group size of 2.

- (3) Claimant requested a hearing on August 7, 2009 contesting the reduction in FAP.
- (4) The Department included in claimant's household when determining benefits.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Food Assistance Program, formerly known as the Food Stamp ("FS") program, is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations ("CFR"). The Department of Human Services ("DHS"), formally known as the Family Independence Agency, administers the FAP program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq* and MAC R 400.3001-3015. Departmental policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual ("PAM"), the Program Eligibility Manual ("PEM"), and the Program Reference Manual ("PRM").

The federal regulations define household income to include all earned income. 7 CFR 273.9(b). All monthly income must be converted to a nonfluctuating monthly amount. Only 80% of earned income is counted in determining FAP benefits. PEM 550. Under 7 CFR 273.9, as amended, \$135.00 is deducted from the gross income of FAP recipients in determining FAP grants.

In the present case, claimant had \$1774 unearned income. The standard deduction of \$132 was taken resulting in adjusted gross income of \$1642. Claimant has shelter expense of \$427. Claimant has net income of \$1215. The Food Assistant Issuance Table shows \$16 in benefit for \$1215 net income. RFT 260 This is the amount determined by the department.

does live in the same household and the parties do eat together and share food, claimant acknowledged this at hearing. It is proper and correct for to be included in the household pursuant to department policy. BEM 212

#### DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law decides that the department was correct in the determination of FAP benefits, and it is ORDERED that the department's decision in this regard be and is hereby AFFIRMED.
