HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9; MSA 16.409 and MCL 400.37; MSA 16.437 upon the Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice a telephone hearing was held on November 25, 2009. The Claimant personally appeared and testified.

ISSUE

Did the Department correctly calculate the Claimant's Food Assistance (FAP)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- (1) The claimant was an ongoing FAP recipient. The group size is three (3).
- (2) On May 18, 2009, the claimant contacted the department's change center to report new employment.
- (3) On May 18, 2009, the department sent the claimant a verification checklist and requested income verification.

- (4) On June, 2, 2009, the department sent he claimant a notice that her FAP was to be reduced to \$107.00 per month. Claimant notified the department that her employment had never begun.
- (5) On September 15, 2009, the Claimant filed a request for a hearing.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) (formerly known as the Food Stamp (FS) program) is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the FAP program pursuant to MCL 400.10, et seq., and MAC R 400.3001-3015. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Tables (PRT).

Obtaining Verification

All Programs

Tell the client what verification is required, how to obtain it, and the due date (see "Timeliness Standards" in this item). Use the DHS-3503, Verification Checklist, or for MA redeterminations, the DHS-1175, MA Determination Notice, to request verification.

Use the DHS-3503C, Verification Checklist for Citizenship/Identity to request documentation of citizenship or identity for FIP, SDA, and Medicaid determinations.

The client must obtain required verification, but you must assist if they need and request help.

If neither the client nor you can obtain verification despite a reasonable effort, use the best available information. If **no** evidence is available, use your best judgment. (PAM 130, pp.2-3).

Here, the claimant contacted the department and notified it that she was unable to get the

prospective employer to provide the requested documentation. The department testified that it

attempted to assist the claimant but was also unsuccessful.

This ALJ finds that the claimant did attempt to provide the requested documentation, and

that the claimant was not employed by the prospective employer.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge based on the above findings of fact and conclusions of

law, REVERSES AND ORDERS the department to remove the prospective income from the

claimant's FAP budgets and recalculate the claimant's FAP, replacing any lost benefits.
