HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9; and MCL 400.37 upon claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, an in-person hearing was held on October 6, 2009

ISSUE

Whether the department properly determined claimant's eligibility for Adult Medical Program (AMP) benefits.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

(1) On or about December 23, 2008, the department sent claimant written notice that her Adult Medical Program (AMP) coverage would be terminated due to excess income.

(2) On or about January 2, 2009, the department received a timely hearing request.

(3) After receipt of hearing request, the department reviewed its proposed negative action and rescinded the action.

(4) Claimant continues to receive Adult Medical Program (AMP) benefits without a break.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

At hearing, the department testified and provided documentary evidence that the department's proposed negative action to terminate claimant's Adult Medical Program (AMP) benefits did not go into effect and has been rescinded. According to department testimony, claimant has not had a break in coverage. Claimant continues to be eligible for Adult Medical Program (AMP) benefits. Finding of Fact 1-4. Department B.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, decides after careful examination of the record, the Administrative Law Judge finds there

is no matter in controversy within the Administrative Law Judge's jurisdiction. The department has rescinded its proposed negative action. Claimant continues to receive benefits.

Accordingly, having no matter in controversy, the hearing request is, **HEREBY, DISMISSED.**
