ORDER OF DISMISSAL

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a hearing was held on April 23, 2009. Claimant's spouse appeared and testified.

Under Program Administrative Manual Item 600, clients have the right to contest any agency decision affecting eligibility or benefit levels whenever they believe the decision is illegal. The agency provides an Administrative Hearing to review the decision and determine if it is appropriate. Agency policy includes procedures to meet the minimal requirements for a fair hearing. Efforts to clarify and resolve the client's concerns start when the agency receives a hearing request and continues through the day of the hearing.

In the present case, on December 9, 2008 applied for SER and was approved if she paid co-payment. Department admitted in hearing the Claimant had provided proof of co-payment being paid. The Department stated they were still attempting to process the payment. The

Department agreed to get the payment processed for the Claimant's SER. The Claimant agreed to this action being taken.

Since the Claimant and the Department have reached an agreement this hearing is hereby DISMISSED.
