
**ORDER OF DISMISSAL**

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a hearing was held on November 8, 2010. Claimant and her representative appeared and testified.

Under Program Administrative Manual Item 600, clients have the right to contest any agency decision affecting eligibility or benefit levels whenever they believe the decision is illegal. The agency provides an Administrative Hearing to review the decision and determine if it is appropriate. Agency policy includes procedures to meet the minimal requirements for a fair hearing. Efforts to clarify and resolve the client's concerns start when the agency receives a hearing request and continues through the day of the hearing.

In the present case, on March 26, 2009, the Claimant's representative requested a hearing, protesting the denial of Child Daycare (CDC) benefits. During the hearing, the Department agreed to process CDC benefits for the Claimant beginning November 2008 through April 2009. The Department stated the Claimant's daycare provider may need to complete a daycare class in order for benefits to be paid. The Department agreed to process the CDC benefits and allow the Claimant's provider the opportunity to obtain the class if necessary for payments to be made for the timeframe in question. The Department also indicated the provider would need to pass the clearance process. The Claimant's representative agreed to this action being taken by the Department.

Since the Department and Claimant's representative have reached an agreement, there is nothing for this Administrative Law Judge to consider, therefore, this case is DISMISSED.

The Claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the mailing of the Decision and Order or, if a timely request for rehearing was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the rehearing decision.
