ORDER OF DISMISSAL

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge by authority of MCL 400.9; and MCL 400.37; upon claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a hearing was held July 16, 2009.

Prior to the closure of the hearing record it was determined that the request for hearing Claimant submitted in this case was moot because the Department subsequently granted Claimant a temporary deferral and her Family Independence Program (FIP) case remained open. The proposed action in the Department's Notice of Case Action (DHS-1605) dated January 12, 2009, was not taken. Claimant's Family Independence Program (FIP) case was closed on June 10, 2009, due to circumstances which occurred months after the written request for hearing in this record. Claimant was advised to submit a written request for hearing regarding the case closure on June 10, 2009, in order to create jurisdiction for an Administrative Law Judge to provide a hearing on those circumstances.

Therefore, it is not necessary for the Administrative Law Judge to decide the matter that was in dispute in January 2009.
