ORDER OF DISMISSAL

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge by authority of MCL 400.9; and MCL 400.37; upon claimant's request for a hearing filed on June 9, 2009. After due notice, a hearing was held August 18, 2009.

Prior to the closure of the hearing record, the department explained the actions to the claimant and the claimant indicated she no longer disagreed with the department's actions. The claimant applied for State Disability Assistance, but was approved for SSI prior to receiving any SDA. Once the SSI income was budgeted into the claimant's Food Assistance Program (FAP) budget, her FAP benefit amount was lowered. The claimant was also approved for Medical Assistance (MA) due to her approval for SSI benefits. The claimant, through her niece and interpreter, indicated that she was now in agreement with the department's actions.

Therefore, it is not necessary for the Administrative Law Judge to decide the matter that was in dispute.

Pursuant to MAC R 400.906 and 400.903, claimant's hearing request is HEREBY DISMISSED, because claimant is no longer aggrieved by a department action.
