ORDER OF DISMISSAL

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge by authority of MCL 400.9; and MCL 400.37; upon claimant's request for a hearing filed on July 13, 2009. After due notice, a hearing was held September 1, 2009.

Prior to the closure of the hearing record, the department representative testified that the BRIDGES computer system did attempt to close the claimant's case early, on August 1, 2009. The information the department received from the Social Security Administration (SSA) showed the claimant would be receiving his RSDI payments beginning on September 1, 2009. The claimant's RSDI payment amount will make him ineligible for Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits. The claimant had a letter from the SSA that indicates his payments will not begin until October, 2009. The department representative testified that she would contact the SSA to determine when the claimant will receive his first payment. If the payment is not received until October, 2009, the claimant will be eligible to receive FAP benefits for the month of September, 2009. If the SSA payment is received in September, 2009, the claimant will not be eligible for September, 2009 FAP benefits. The claimant testified that this satisfied his hearing issue.

Therefore, it is not necessary for the Administrative Law Judge to decide the matter that was in dispute. Pursuant to MAC R 400.906 and 400.903, claimant's hearing request is **HEREBY DISMISSED**, because claimant is no longer aggrieved by a department action.
