### HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon claimant's request for a hearing to protest the denial of claimant's application for Medical Assistance (MA-P) and retroactive Medical Assistance. After due notice, a hearing was held on January 20, 2010. Claimant was represented by

#### **ISSUE**

Whether claimant meets the disability criteria for Medical Assistance and retroactive Medical Assistance.

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

On June 9, 2009, an application was filed on claimant's behalf for MA-P benefits.
 The application requested MA-P retroactive to February of 2009.

- 2) On August 28, 2009, the department denied claimant's application for benefits based upon the belief that claimant did not meet the requisite disability criteria.
- 3) On November 9, 2009, a hearing request was filed to protest the department's determination.
- 4) Prior to the hearing, the Social Security Administration determined that the claimant met the disability criteria for Retirement, Survivor's and Disability Insurance program effective February 13, 2009.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

Because of the Social Security Administration determination, it is not necessary for the Administrative Law Judge to discuss the issue of disability. PEM, Item 260.

The department is required to initiate a determination of claimant's financial eligibility for the requested benefits, if not previously done.

#### **DECISION AND ORDER**

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, decides that claimant meets the definition of medically disabled under the Medical Assistance program as of February of 2009.

#### 2010-10938/LSS

Accordingly, the department is ordered to initiate a review of the June 9, 2009, application, if it has not already done so, to determine if all other non-medical eligibility criteria are met. The department shall inform claimant and his authorized representative of its determination in writing.
