HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9; MSA 16.409 and MCL 400.37; MSA 16.437 upon the Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice a telephone hearing was held on June 10, 2010. The Claimant personally appeared and testified.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly figure his/her Medical Assistance (MA)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. On September 16, 2009, the claimant had his/her MA reviewed.
2. On September 16, 2009, the Department ran a MA budget for the claimant based on his/her unearned income of \$938.00/mo. creating a deductible of \$543.00.
3. On October 5, 2009, the Claimant filed a request for a hearing.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, et seq., and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

In the instant case, the Claimant questions the Department's calculation of his/her MA.

The undersigned has reviewed the MA budget and found it to be correct. The Claimant's net unearned income is \$938.00. After deductions for work expense and child support the net income was \$918.00, minus a protected income limit of \$375.00 equals a \$543.00 deductible. (RFT 240, p.1).

The protected income level (PIL) is a set allowance for non-medical need items such as shelter, food and incidental expenses. PRT 240 lists the Group 2 MA PILs based on shelter area and fiscal group size. (PEM 544, p. 1).

This ALJ sympathizes with the claimant but there is nothing that can be done to change the above equation.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, AFFIRMS the Department's actions in the instant case.
