ORDER OF DISMISSAL

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon the Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on August 25, 2010. The Claimant appeared at the hearing and testified. [REDACTED], FIM and [REDACTED], FIS appeared on behalf of the Department.

The regulations governing hearing and appeals for applicants and recipients of public assistance in Michigan are found in the Michigan Administrative Code. MAC R 400.901-.951. MAC R 400.903 reads in part: An opportunity for a hearing shall be granted to an applicant who requests a hearing because his claim for assistance is denied or is not acted upon with reasonable promptness, and to any recipient who is aggrieved by a Department action resulting in suspension, reduction, discontinuance, or termination of assistance.

In the present case, Claimant filed a request for hearing. The Department however has not currently taken a negative action or failed to act in a timely manner regarding benefits or services to the Claimant. Claimant testified that the Department has since provided benefits requested and she requested that the hearing request be dismissed.

Therefore this hearing is DISMISSED pursuant to MAC R 400.903(1). BAM 600.
