HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9; MSA 16.409 and MCL 400.37; MSA 16.437 upon the Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice a telephone hearing was held on May 6, 2010. The Claimant personally appeared and testified.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly figure his/her Medical Assistance (MA)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- On October 15, 2009, the Department ran a MA budget for the Claimant based on his/her unearned income of \$2,038.00/mo.
- 2. On October 7, 2009, the Claimant filed a request for a hearing.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Medical Assistance (MA) program was designed to assist needy persons with medical expenses. The State of Michigan has set guidelines for income, which determines if a MA group falls within the needy classification. Under PEM 544 and 545 an eligible MA has income the same as or less than the "protected income level" plus medical insurance premiums as set forth in the policy contained in the program reference table. An individual or MA group whose income is in excess of the monthly protected income level is ineligible to receive MA.

However, a MA group may become eligible for assistance under the deductible program. A deductible is a process which allows a client with excess income to become eligible for MA, if sufficient allowable medical expenses are incurred. Each calendar month is a separate deductible period. The fiscal group's monthly excess income is called the deductible amount. Meeting a deductible means reporting and verifying allowable medical expenses that equal or exceed the deductible amount for the calendar month. The MA group must report expenses by the last day of the third month following the month for which it wants medical coverage. PEM 545; CFR 435.831

In the instant case, the Claimant questions the Department's calculation of his/her MA.

The MA figures presented are in conflict and the budget needs to be refigured. The department has agreed to refigure the claimant's budget and use one figure for her income.

The protected income level (PIL) is a set allowance for non-medical need items such as shelter, food and incidental expenses.

PRT 240 lists the Group 2 MA PILs based on shelter area and fiscal group size. (PEM 544, p. 1)

And:

The claimant lives in area IV and the protected income level is \$532.00. (RFT 240, p.1).

The department agreed to refigure the claimant's MA deductable with the income figures that the claimant agreed with at the hearing.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, ORDERS the department to refigure the claimant's MA deductable based on correct income figures.
