HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9; MSA 16.409 and MCL 400.37; MSA 16.437 upon claimant's December 7, 2009 request for a hearing to protest the department's denial of his medical review for Medical Assistance and State Disability Assistance. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held Wednesday, February 10,

2010. The claimant personally appeared and testified on his own behalf.

<u>ISSUE</u>

Whether claimant meets the disability criteria for Medical Assistance (MA-P) and State Disability Assistance (SDA)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

 The claimant was a recipient of Medical Assistance and State Disability Assistance with a medical review due September 2009. (2) Subsequent to the hearing, the Social Security Administration determined that the claimant met the disability criteria for the SSI program effective

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The State Disability Assistance (SDA) program which provides financial assistance for disabled persons is established by 2004 PA 344. The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the SDA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MAC R 400.3151-400.3180. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

Because of the Social Security Administration determination, it is not necessary for the Administrative Law Judge to discuss the issue of disability. PEM, Item 260; PEM, Item 261.

The claimant is eligible for Medical Assistance retroactive to his medical review date of September 2009 and State Disability Assistance based on his medical review date of September 2009.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, decides that the claimant meets the definition of medically disabled under the Medical

Assistance program retroactive to September 2009 and State Disability Assistance based on his medical review date of September 2009.

Accordingly, if it has not already done so, the department is ORDERED to open an

ongoing Medical Assistance case for the claimant effective the month of the SSI entitlement.


