HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon the Claimant's request for hearing. After due notice, a telephone hearing was conducted from Detroit, Michigan on February 11, 2010. The Claimant was present and testified along with her husband, Lisa Donel, FIM, appeared on behalf of the Department.

ISSUE

Whether the Department properly denied Claimant's Food Assistance Program ("FAP") benefits effective 12/14/09?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. Claimant applied for FAP benefits on 11/2/2009.
- 2. The Department did not have Claimant's social security income on the system.

- 3. The Department issued a verification request to Claimant and also incorrectly denied Claimant FAP benefits on 11/24/09.
- 4. At the hearing, due to the confusion of receiving a denial and request for verification at the same time, the Department agreed to accept Claimant's income verification and reopen Claimant's FAP case from the date of closure.
- 5. As a result of this agreement, Claimant indicated that she no longer wished to proceed with a hearing.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) (formerly known as the Food Stamp (FS) program) is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the FAP program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MAC R 400.3001-3015. Department policies are found in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) and the Reference Tables (RFT).

Under Bridges Administrative Manual Item 600, clients have the right to contest any agency decision affecting eligibility or benefit levels whenever they believe the decision is illegal. The agency provides an Administrative Hearing to review the decision and determine if it is appropriate. Agency policy includes procedures to meet the minimal requirements for a fair hearing. Efforts to clarify and resolve the client's concerns start when the agency receives a hearing request and continues through the day of the hearing.

In the present case the department has agreed to reopen Claimant's FAP case as of the date of closure, 12/14/09, make a FAP determination utilizing income verification provided at

the hearing and award benefits from the date of application if Claimant is eligible. As a result of

this agreement, Claimant indicated she no longer wished to proceed with the hearing. Since the

Claimant and the Department have come to an agreement it is unnecessary for this

Administrative Law Judge to make a decision regarding the facts and issues in this case.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the findings of fact and conclusions of law,

finds that the Department and Claimant have come to a settlement regarding claimant's request

for a hearing.

Accordingly, it is ORDERED that:

1. The Department shall reopen Claimant's FAP benefits from the date of closure,

12/14/09.

2. The Department shall make a determination on Claimant's FAP eligibility utilizing

the income verification provided at the hearing.

2. The Department shall supplement the Claimant for any lost benefits she was

otherwise entitled to receive from the date of application.
