HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9; MSA 16.409 and MCL 400.37; MSA 16.437 upon claimant's request for a hearing to protest the denial of claimant's application for MA and SDA. After due notice, an in-person hearing was held on March 25, 2010, in Jackson, Michigan at Jackson County DHS. Claimant was represented at the administrative hearing by

ISSUE

Whether claimant meets the disability criteria for Medical Assistance (MA) and State Disability Assistance (SDA)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- (1) On August 3, 2009, claimant applied for MA-P and SDA with the Michigan DHS.
- (2) Claimant applied for two months of retro MA.
- (3) On September 28, 2010, MRT denied.

- (4) On January 11, 2010, the department issued notice.
- (5) On February 29, 2010, claimant filed a hearing request.
- (6) On March 31, 2010, SHRT denied claimant.
- (7) At the conclusion of the hearing, the record was held open at claimant's request for the submission of additional medical records. Medical records were received and submitted to the State Hearing Review Team (SHRT), and on April 7, 2010, SHRT once again denied claimant.
- (8) Subsequent to the hearing, but prior to the review by the undersigned Administrative Law Judge, the Social Security Administration determined that the claimant met the disability criteria for the programs with a disability onset date of June 29, 2009.
- (9) On July 17, 2010, the undersigned Administrative Law Judge received verification from claimant's representative from the Social Security Administration indicating claimant was approved disability benefits by SSA. Claimant's onset date is identified as June, 2009. There are no months left for review.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The State Disability Assistance (SDA) program which provides financial assistance for disabled persons is established by 2004 PA 344. The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the SDA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MAC R 400.3151-400.3180. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative

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Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual

(PRM).

Because of the Social Security Administration determination, it is not necessary for the

Administrative Law Judge to discuss the issue of disability. PEM, Item 260; PEM, Item 261.

The department is required to initiate a determination of claimant's financial eligibility

for the requested benefits, if required by DHS policy and procedure.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions

of law, decides that the claimant meets the definition of medically disabled under the Medical

Assistance and State Disability Assistance programs as of the June 29, 2009 application date,

including any retro MA months if otherwise eligible, and as permitted under policy and

procedure.

The department shall review this case in accordance with its usual policy and procedure.
