HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9; and MCL 400.37 upon claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held March 18, 2010.

ISSUE

Whether the Department of Human Services (Department) properly computed the Claimant's Food Assistance Program (FAP) eligibility?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- (1) Claimant is a FAP recipient.
- (2) On January 21, 2010, the Deptment sent notice to the Claimant that she was not eligible for FAP Benefits.

- (3) Claimant has a group size of two for FAP budgeting purposes.
- (4) Claimant and her roommate have a combined gross monthly income of month. (Department Exhibit 5)
- (5) On January 27, 2010, the Department received Claimant's hearing request, protesting the denial of FAP benefits.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) (formerly known as the Food Stamp program, is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (DHS or Department), administers the FAP program pursuant to MCL 400.10, et seq., and MAC R 400.3001-3015. Department policies are found in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Reference Table Manual (RFT), and the Bridges Reference Manual (BRM).

For FAP purposes, all earned and unearned income available to the Claimant is countable. Earned income means income received from another person or organization or from self-employment for duties for duties that were performed for compensation or profit. Unearned income means all income that is not earned, including but not limited to funds received from the Family Independence Program (FIP), State Disability Assistance (SDA), Child Development and Care (CDC), Medicaid (MA), Social Security Benefits (RSDI/SSI), Veterans Administration (VA), Unemployment Compensation Benefits (UCB), Adult Medical Program (AMA), alimony, and child support payments. The amount counted may be fore than the client actually receives because the gross amount is used prior to any deductions. BEM 500.

The Department determines a client's eligibility for program benefits based on the client's actual income and/or prospective income. Actual income is income that was already received. Prospective income is income not yet received but expected. Prospective budgeting is the best estimate of the client's future income. BEM 505.

All income is converted to a standard monthly amount. If the client is paid weekly, the Department multiplies the average weekly amount by 4.3. If the client is paid every other week, the Department multiplies the average bi-weekly amount by 2.15. BEM 505.

Claimant has a group size of two, which includes herself and her roommate. It is mandatory that claimant's roommate must be considered part of her group for FAP budgeting because they share living quarters where they usually sleep. BEM 212.

Claimant testified that her roommate's income should not be considered because the roommate is under no duty to use her income to take care of the Claimant. However, the manner in which household members choose to allocate their individual earned income is not a factor for FAP allotment budgeting.

Claimant and her roommate have a gross monthly income for FAP budgeting purposes of per month. The gross income limit for a group of two people is ______. Based on the testimony and documentation offered at the hearing, I find that the Department established that it acted in accordance with policy in computing the Claimant's FAP eligibility.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, decides that the Department acted in accordance with policy in computing Claimant's FAP eligibility.

Accordingly, the Department's FAP eligibility determination is AFFIRMED, it is SO ORDERED.
