HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, an in-person hearing was held on May 5, 2010, in Kalamazoo. The claimant personally appeared and testified under oath. The claimant was represented by [REDACTED], from [REDACTED].

The department was represented by Diana Walker (ES).

The claimant requested additional time to submit new medical evidence. Claimant waived the timeliness requirement so her new medical evidence could be reviewed by SHRT.

ISSUES

- (1) Did claimant establish a severe mental impairment expected to preclude her from substantial gainful work, **continuously**, for one year (MA-P) or 90 days (SDA)?
- (2) Did claimant establish a severe physical impairment expected to preclude her from substantial gainful work, **continuously**, for one year (MA-P) or 90 days (SDA)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- (1) Claimant is an MA-P/SDA applicant (July 30, 2008) who was denied by SHRT (March 12, 2010) based on claimant's ability to perform her past relevant work.
- (2) Claimant's vocational factors are: age--25; education—high school diploma (special education); work experience—food service assistant at [REDACTED] and camp counselor.
- (3) Claimant has not performed Substantial Gainful Activity (SGA) since she worked at [REDACTED] as a food services assistant in 2006.
- (4) Claimant has the following unable-to-work complaints:
 - (a) Seizures;
 - (b) Obsessive compulsive disorder;
 - (c) Deep vein thrombosis;
 - (d) Depression;
 - (e) Attention deficit hyperactivity disorder;
 - (f) Borderline personality disorder;
 - (g) Traumatic brain injury;
 - (h) Cognitive disorder.
- (5) On February 17, 2011, the Social Security Administration approved claimant for SSI benefits with a disability onset date of July 8, 2006.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

LEGAL BASE

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

The State Disability Assistance (SDA) program which provides financial assistance for disabled persons is established by 2004 PA 344. The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the SDA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MAC R 400.3151-400.3180. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

On February 17, 2011, the Social Security Administration approved claimant for SSI benefits with a disability onset date of July 8, 2006.

Therefore, the Administrative Law Judge does not have jurisdiction to rule on the issue of disability at this time.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, decides that claimant meets the MA-P/SDA disability requirements under PEM 260/261. Claimant is disabled for MA-P/SDA purposes based on the recent approval by the Social Security Administration.

Accordingly, the department's denial of claimant's MA-P/SDA application is, hereby, REVERSED.

The department shall open claimant's MA-P/SDA case effective July 1, 2008.
