HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on June 30, 2010.

ISSUE

Was verification compliance established?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- Negative case action: MA application in early August, 2009 was denied on
 October 22, 2009, based on verifications noncompliance.
- (2) On October 8, 2009, the DHS requested the claimant to complete the verification check-list information and return by October 19, 2009; it was not returned by the due-date.
- (3) The requested verification was mailed by the claimant with a DHS receipt date stamped of October 21, 2009.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

Facts above are undisputed.

The client might be unable to answer a question about himself or another person whose circumstances must be known. Allow the client at least 10 days (or other timeframe specified in policy) to obtain the needed information. PAM, Item 105, p. 5.

The claimant testified and stated two different dates for mailing and returning the verification check-list. But, the undisputed facts established that the return mailing was received by the DHS after the due-date.

Therefore, this ALJ is not persuaded by the preponderance of the evidence that timely verification compliance was established.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, decides that verification was compliance was not established.

Accordingly, MA denial is UPHELD.
