HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a hearing was held on September 1, 2010. The Claimant's representative appeared and testified.

ORDER OF DISMISSAL

Under Program Administrative Manual Item 600, clients have the right to contest any Department decision affecting eligibility or benefit levels whenever they believe the decision is illegal. The Department provides an Administrative Hearing to review the decision and determine if it is appropriate. Department policy includes procedures to meet the minimal requirements for a fair hearing. Efforts to clarify and resolve the client's concerns start when the Department receives a hearing request and continues through the day of the hearing.

In the present case, on June 16, 2009, the Claimant requested a hearing, protesting the denial of an MA application for failure to return verifications regarding citizenship. During the hearing, the Claimant's representative presented L-Letter 10-027, which provides direction regarding a policy change regarding citizenship and its direct application to older case actions. Specifically:


"any administrative hearings that are pending due to lack of documentation for citizenship or ID should also be reviewed to determine if the client claimed to be a U.S. citizen. If so, the case should have the new policy applied to it"

The Department agreed to reprocess the application in accordance with the L-Letter 10-027. The Claimant agreed to this action being taken.

DECISION AND ORDER

Since the parties have reached an agreement, no issue remains for this ALJ to determine.

Therefore, Claimant's hearing request is hereby DISMISSED.
