HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon the claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on November 8, 2010. The claimant appeared and testified.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly close the claimant's Medical Assistance (MA)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds a material fact:

- 1. On December 20, 2009, the department sent the claimant's MA case to the Medical Review Team (MRT).
- 2. On December 28, 2009, the department received a response that the claimant's MA could be closed because he had not appealed a disability denial from the Social Security Administration (SSA).
- 3. On March 8, 2010, the claimant filed a request for a hearing.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by the Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL

400.105. Department policies are found in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

In the instant case, the claimant's MA was closed because he had failed to appeal a denial from the SSA.

Final SSI Eligibility Determination

Once SSA's decision is **final**, the local office **must take the following actions:**

For clients receiving MA, SSA's determination that disability or blindness does not exist for SSI is final and the MA case must be closed if:

The determination was made after 1/1/90, and No further appeals may be made at SSA (see "Exhibit II" in BEM 260), or The client failed to file an appeal at any step within SSA's 60 day limit, and The client is not claiming:

A totally different disabling condition than the condition SSA based its determination on, **or**

An additional impairment(s) or change or deterioration in his condition that SSA has not made a determination on. (BEM 271, pp. 8-9)

The claimant failed to appeal his denial from SSA, therefore the MA case must be closed as stated above.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, AFFIRMS the Department's action in the instant case.
