HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon the Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a hearing was held in Detroit, Michigan, on Wednesday, February 23, 2011. The Claimant appeared and testified. The Claimant was represented by

Department of Human Services ("Department").

During the hearing, the Claimant waived the time period for the issuance of this decision in order to allow for the submission of additional medical records. The evidence was received, reviewed, and forwarded to the State Hearing Review Team ("SHRT") for consideration. On June 7, 2011, the SHRT found the Claimant disabled. This matter is now before the undersigned for a final decision.

<u>ISSUE</u>

Whether the Department properly determined that the Claimant was not disabled for purposes of the Medical Assistance ("MA-P") benefit program?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. The Claimant submitted an application for public assistance seeking MA-P benefits on August 2, 2010.
- 2. On August 18, 2010, the Medical Review Team ("MRT") found the Claimant not disabled. (Exhibit 1, pp. 1, 2)

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- 3. On August 21, 2010, the Department notified the Claimant of the MRT determination. (Exhibit 2)
- 4. On September 13, 2010, the Department received the Claimant's timely written request for hearing. (Exhibit 3)
- 5. On October 1, 2010, the SHRT found the Claimant not disabled. (Exhibit 4)
- 6. The Claimant alleged physical disabling impairments due to back pain, hand pain, shortness of breath, congestive heart failure, high blood pressure, and headaches/dizziness.
- 7. The Claimant alleged mental disabling impairments due to mood disorder.
- 8. At the time of hearing, the Claimant was 53 years old with a birth date; was 5'3" in height; and weighed 185 pounds.
- 9. The Claimant is a high school graduate with an employment history as a general laborer.
- 10. The Claimant's impairment's have lasted, or are expected to last, continuously for a period of 12 months or longer.
- 11. On June 7, 2010, the SHRT found the Claimant disabled.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Medical Assistance ("MA") program is established by Subchapter XIX of Chapter 7 of The Public Health & Welfare Act, 42 USC 1397, and is administered by the Department, formerly known as the Family Independence Agency, pursuant to MCL 400.10 *et seq.* and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Bridges Administrative Manual ("BAM"), the Bridges Eligibility Manual ("BEM"), and the Bridges Reference Manual ("BRM").

Because of the SHRT determination, it is not necessary for the Administrative Law Judge to discuss the issue of disability pursuant to BAM 600. Accordingly, the Department is required to initiate a determination of the Claimant's financial eligibility for the requested benefits, if not previously completed.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, finds the Claimant disabled for purposes of the MA-P benefit program.

Accordingly, it is Ordered:

- 1. The Department's original determination is REVERSED.
- 2. The Department shall initiate review of the August 2, 2010, application (if not previously completed) to determine if all other non-medical criteria are met and inform the Claimant and her Authorized Representative of the determination in accordance with policy.
- 3. The Department shall supplement for lost benefits, if any, that the Claimant was entitled to receive if otherwise eligible and qualified in accordance with Department policy.
- 4. The Department shall review the Claimant's continued eligibility in July 2012 in accordance with Department policy.
