ORDER OF DISMISSAL

This matter is before the undersigned by authority of MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon Claimant's request for a hearing filed on October 14, 2009. After due notice, a hearing was held.

Department of Human Services (DHS) originally attempted to terminate Claimant's Medical Assistance benefits due to an alleged failure by Claimant to cooperate in the process which determines whether Claimant was disabled. Prior to the closure of the hearing record, Claimant and the representative from Department of Human Services (DHS) agreed that the issue that led to the filing of Claimant's hearing request has been resolved favorably for Claimant. It is therefore not necessary for the undersigned to decide the matter that was previously in dispute. Pursuant to MAC R 400.906 and 400.903, Claimant's hearing request is hereby DISMISSED.

The issue of whether Claimant is or is not disabled remains unresolved at the administrative law judge level. DHS has determined that Claimant is not a disabled person and Claimant indicated that she disputes this determination and has requested an administrative hearing for this issue.
