HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a hearing was held on January 21, 2010. Claimant was represented by [REDACTED].

ISSUE

Did the Department of Human Services (DHS or department) properly consider claimant's application for Medical Assistance (MA)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1) On July 30, 2009, claimant's authorized representative filed an application on claimant's behalf for MA benefits. The application requested MA retroactive to June of 2009.
- 2) On September 26, 2009, the department denied the Adult Medical Program.

- 3) On October 14, 2009, a hearing request was filed on claimant's behalf to protest the department's failure to consider claimant's request for MA.
- 4) At the hearing, the parties reached an accord. The department agreed to initiate consideration of claimant's July 30, 2009, application for MA. The department further agreed to notify claimant and her authorized representative of its determination in writing.
- 5) Claimant's authorized representative indicated satisfaction with the department's plan of action.


#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

The law provides that disposition may be made of a contested case by stipulation or agreed settlement. MCL 24.278(2). In this case, the parties reached an accord. The department agreed to initiate consideration of claimant's July 30, 2009, application for MA. The department further agreed to provide claimant and her authorized representative with written notification of its determination. Claimant's authorized representative indicated satisfaction with the department's plan of action.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, decides that the Department of Human Services shall initiate consideration of claimant's July 30, 2009, application for Medical Assistance. The department shall provide claimant and her authorized representative with written notification of its determination.
