HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on July 29, 2010. The claimant personally appeared and provided testimony.

ISSUE

Did the department properly determine the claimant's Adult Medical Program (AMP) case should close due to excess income in December, 2009?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. The claimant was receiving AMP benefits when the department determined that her Unemployment Compensation Benefits (UCB) exceeded the income limit for the AMP program. (Department Exhibit 1, 2)

2. On December 12, 2009, the department mailed the claimant a Notice of Case Action indicating the claimant's AMP case would close due to excess income. (Department Exhibit 3 - 5)

3. The claimant submitted a hearing request on December 22, 2009.

### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Adult Medical Program (AMP) is established by Title XXI of the Social Security Act; (1115)(a)(1) of the Social Security Act, and is administered by the Department of Human Services (DHS or department) pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.* Department policies are contained in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

Department policy states:

#### **Income Eligibility**

#### **Application**

Income eligibility exists when the program group's **net** income does not exceed the program group's AMP income limit.

**Income Limit.** The AMP income limits are in PRT 236. When the client's living arrangement changes during a month, use the living arrangement with the higher income limit.

Department policy requires the department to count a claimant's income, such as UCB in determining eligibility for the AMP program. PEM 500. In this case, the claimant was receiving \$786 in UCB benefits monthly at the time of the action. The department considered \$632 of this income for the AMP determination.

The income limits for AMP coverage are contained in PRT 236. The table lists the income limit at \$316. The claimant was over the income limit and, therefore, is not eligible for AMP coverage.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, decides that the department properly found the claimant had excess income for AMP coverage in December, 2009.

Accordingly, the department's determination is UPHeld. SO ORDERED.
