**HEARING DECISION**

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon the Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on September 22, 2010. The Claimant appeared and testified. [REDACTED] appeared on behalf of the Department.

**ISSUE**

Was the Department correct in denying Claimant's Adult Medical Program application?

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- (1) Claimant applied for the Adult Medical Program on December 22, 2009.
- (2) Claimant's application was denied because the program was closed.
- (3) Claimant requested a hearing on December 28, 2010 contesting the denial of AMP benefits.

**CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

The Adult Medical Program (AMP) is established by Title XXI of the Social Security Act; (1115)(a)(1) of the Social Security Act, and is administered by the Department of

Human Services (DHS or department) pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.* Department policies are contained in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

In the present case, Claimant did not allege that he was disabled in his application. Claimant confirmed at hearing that he is not disabled. Therefore the only medical coverage he was potentially eligible for was the Adult Medical Program. The Adult Medical Program was closed at the time of Claimant's application on December 22, 2009. BEM 640. Therefore the Department was correct to deny Claimant's AMP application.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, finds that the Department properly denied Claimant's Adult Medical Program application because the program was closed, and it is ORDERED that the Department's decision in this regard be, and is, hereby AFFIRMED.
