HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon the claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on December 2, 2010. The Claimant did not appear. The Claimant's daughter with power of attorney, [REDACTED], and [REDACTED], a witness, appeared on behalf of the claimant. The Department's representatives [REDACTED] Assistant Payments Supervisor, and [REDACTED], ES appeared and testified on behalf of the Department.

ISSUE

Whether the Department properly denied the Claimant's application for Medical Assistance dated due to failure to return the requested asset verification information and form?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds a material fact:

1. The Claimant's daughter applied for Medical Assistance for her mother on September 9, 2009.
2. The department sent a verification checklist to the claimant's daughter, at the correct address, on February 11, 2010 with a due date of February 22, 2010. Exhibit 1
3. The Claimant lives in a long-term care facility and was seeking medical assistance.

4. The Claimant's daughter did receive the verification checklist; however, she did not provide a response to the department by the due date to any of the requested information.
5. The claimant's representative did not request an extension of time or seek assistance from the department with regard to the verification checklist requirements or information requested.
6. The department denied the claimant's application on March 19, 2010 by notice of case action for failure to return the requested information in response to the verification checklist. Exhibit 2
7. The claimant's representative requested a hearing protesting the denial of the application on April 6, 2010 the department received the request for a hearing on June 10, 2010.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by the Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

Clients must cooperate with the local office in determining initial and ongoing eligibility to provide verification. BAM 130, p. 1. The information might be from the client or a third party. Id. The Department can use documents, collateral contacts or home calls to verify information. Id. The client should be allowed 10 calendar days to provide the verification. If the client cannot provide the verification despite a reasonable effort, the time limit to provide should be extended at least once. BAM 130, p.4; BEM 702. If the client refuses to provide the information or has not made a reasonable effort within the specified time period, then policy directs that a negative action be issued. BAM 130, p. 4. Before making an eligibility determination, however, the department must give the client a reasonable opportunity to resolve any discrepancy between his statements and information from another source. BAM 130, p. 6.

In this case, the Department mailed out a request for verification of assets requesting that information be returned by the due date and sent it to the last known address provided to the Department and to the Claimant's daughter who had filed the application on behalf of her mother. The claimant's representative did receive the verification checklist but did not respond to it. The department never received a response to the request for the verifications and thus correctly denied the application. The Department


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denied the claimant's medical assistance application of March 19, 2010 because it never received a response from the Claimant or her daughter.

Based upon these facts and circumstances it is found that the Department did properly deny the Claimant's application for Medical Assistance because the requested asset verification information was never returned to the Department.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, finds that the evidence presented at the hearing did support the decision of the Department to deny the Claimant's Medicaid application for failure to return the requested the verification information and therefore, the Department's decision is AFFIRMED.
