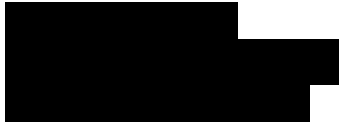

HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a hearing was held on January 4, 2010. Claimant appeared and testified.

The record was extended to allow for the submission of additional medical documentation and exams.

ISSUE

Whether the Department properly determined the claimant is not "disabled" for purposes of Medical Assistance (MA) program?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as a material fact:

1. On November 19, 2008, the Claimant applied for MA and retro MA.
2. On March 18, 2009, MRT denied the Claimant's request.
3. On June 15, 2009, the Claimant submitted to the Department a request for hearing.
4. The State Hearing and Review Team denied.
5. Subsequent to the hearing, the Social Security Administration determined that the Claimant met the disability criteria for the SSI program effective August 1, 2008 on October 22, 2010.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The State Disability Assistance (SDA) program which provides financial assistance for disabled persons is established by 2004 PA 344. The Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the SDA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MAC R 400.3151-400.3180. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

Because of the Social Security Administration determination, it is not necessary for the Administrative Law Judge to discuss the issue of disability, per Program Eligibility Manual, Item 260.


The Department is required to initiate a determination of the Claimant's financial eligibility for the requested benefits, if not previously done.

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, decides that the Claimant is medically disabled under the MA program as of August 1, 2008.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, decides that the Claimant is medically disabled under the MA program as of August 1, 2008.

Accordingly, the Department's decision is hereby ORDERED to open an ongoing MA case for the Claimant effective August 1, 2008, if otherwise eligible.

NOTICE: Administrative Hearings may order a rehearing or reconsideration on either its own motion or at the request of a party within 30 days of the mailing date of this Decision and Order.
